GOOGLE WORKSPACE

Each grade level will have a Google Site and each subject shall have a Google Classroom, which will serve as the virtual for interaction and learning. room Students shall learn through both asynchronous (self-paced) activities. which will be accessible via the Google Classroom and synchronous (scheduled) sessions with the teachers using Google Meet or Zoom.

The Google Site for each batch shall serve as an advisory page for announcements, general reminders, summary of deadlines, and personal formation/class advisory activities.

ONLINE LEARNING ACTIVITIES

The school understands the need to make learning accessible, even when internet becomes unavailable or technical problems occur. Thus, online learning activities will include a variety of resources.

- a) Downloadable & printable lesson guides & worksheets
- reminders, **b) Engaging online activities (interactive websites,** ad personal **teacher-made applications, simulations, forums)**
 - c) Scheduled virtual class (video conference) with the teachers
 - d) Videos & podcasts as supplement to the lesson
 - e) Assessments in projects, worksheets or Google forms quizzes

Online virtual classes shall be recorded or other options will be given to students if they miss the online discussion..

Given the present situation, parents, teachers and students are now challenged to maximize technology for education. There are unlimited possibilities for learning through various online educational tools. Teachers shall be incorporating these opportunities for interactive learning in their online lessons. Students are likewise encouraged to be responsible in their studies and be protagonists of their own learning.

SUPPORT THROUGH FEEDBACK

STUDENT-TEACHER COMMUNICATION

Students will continue to have an advisory class, where a teacher shall serve as their class adviser. The adviser shall regularly keep in touch with the students through the Google Site, Google Meetups, Google Chat, e-mail, or messaging.



STUDENT-MENTOR COMMUNICATION

Mentors will continue to have the regular conversations (chats) with their mentees, through the varied platforms available, to give them the needed support in their learning and personal development.

STUDENT-STUDENT COMMUNICATION

Students shall be able to communicate with each other via messaging in the Google Classroom only if the teacher has set-up a group for a collaborative activity. A similar system may be designed by the teacher using other online tools. During synchronous online discussions, the teacher may also facilitate peer interaction. Otherwise, students may personally communicate with each other outside the virtual classroom for non-academic purposes.

PARENT-TEACHER COMMUNICATION

Should parents need to communicate with the teacher for school concerns, the e-mail addresses of the teachers shall be available on the Google Site. Parent Orientations are given 2-3 weeks before the opening of classes each school year.

PARENT-MENTOR COMMUNICATION

The close collaboration of mentors with parents for their daughter's formation continues through regular communication. Parents may also course feedback, questions and concerns through the mentors.



BLENDED LEARNING

The school has designed a 2-week cycle to accommodate all the subjects and allow enough time for both asynchronous and synchronous learning. A schedule will be released per grade level. Although the asynchronous activity is assigned a learning time, the schedule to do these activities at home is flexible. What is important to consider is the time for the synchronous classes.


Should the health situation improve, there will be a transition to a blended learning program. Blended learning combines classroom learning with online learning, in which students can, in part, control the time, pace, and place of their learning. (Tucker, 2013) For face-to-face classroom learning, the class size shall be limited to an average of 15 students and will only be scheduled on some days of the time, pace and place of their learning within week. The days shall vary depending on grade levels.

Throughout the process, the teacher is the facilitator of learning, whether at a distance or in school. Blended learning is different from a homeschool program, where the parents serve as the teacher of their child/children.

PAREF Rosehill shall only transition to blended learning when the circumstances permit, following the directives and precautionary measures advised by the authorities and with the health, safety and well-being of its students, and of the whole Rosehill community, as its foremost consideration.

In the case of allowable return to school, parents have the option of letting their daughter learn from home. All lessons shall be accessible online for the entire school year.





LEARNING TERMS

Asynchronous learning - learning activity that is self-paced; students can control the a given period of time.

ex. reading material, interactive websites,

Synchronous learning - learning activity that is scheduled to take place at a specific time and place; real-time interaction with the teacher and possibly classmate ex. discussions on Google Meet

Learning Management System (LMS) software that enables institutions such as schools to create and manage information, learning materials, communication online resources and other tools.

Online Check-in - teachers, advisers or mentors briefly get in touch online with an individual or small group; this may be done via online video call. phone or by messaging

LEARNING & COMMUNICATION CHANNELS

Teachers shall be regularly interacting with students:

- ·Messages to the teacher can be sent via Google Classroom or email
- ·Class Advisers will get in touch with students daily.

Teachers shall be delivering module type lessons that contain the most essential points about each topic.

Modules will be given in various ways ex. reading material, interactive websites, video, online classes

What is crucial is the student's independent and responsible learning. They need to keep motivated to access the materials and attend the online classes.

Teachers will be available for consultation via Google Classroom messaging or email.

Mentor and parents chats shall take place through varied platforms available such as Facebook messenger, Viber or landline phone calls.



Questions/clarifications sent to the teachers until 2:00 pm can be answered by the teachers within the day until 4:00 pm, those forwarded after 2:00 pm will be answered the following day.

Projects will focus on authentic tasks & 21st century skills.




To instill order and responsibility in our students, every lesson will still be time bound and assessments / PTs shall have deadlines. Teachers adjust timelines to an online learning pace.

Assessments for online learning will be different. They are more project based; authentic meaningful assessments. For most of the subjects, the "term exam" will be more in the form of a final project performance task.
